Public/Private Partners Launch Talent Campaign

The Workforce Coalition has launched a talent retention and attraction campaign with the goal of growing the working population of the Jefferson City area. We need the help of every Chamber member to help get our message out on a regional basis.

The Workforce Coalition is a joint venture of the Chamber and the Jefferson City Regional Economic Partnership. For the last year, the Coalition's Talent Attraction Team has acquired market research on the campaign's target audience and the benefits of living, working and playing in Jefferson City. Members of the team also stepped up to fund the talent campaign, with partners including the City

of Jefferson, Cole County, Jefferson City Convention and Visitor Bureau, Jefferson City Regional Economic Partnership, Jefferson City Area Board of Realtors, Jefferson City School District and the

The campaign "JCMO: Live. Grow. Home." aims to attract a talented workforce and enhance the region's sustainability and growth. The message is designed to bring new individuals and families to our community and to convince past residents to make the community their home again.

Amy Sublett, Executive Director of the Central Workforce Development Board, cochairs the Workforce Coalition and leads the Talent Attraction Team. "Workforce availability is an important issue impacting many industries and communities," said Sublett. "This is a proactive approach intended to set Jefferson City apart."

In addition to some very dedicated partners, the campaign has benefitted from the creativity of three local marketing firms, including Imagemark Marketing & Advertising, Cosmic Sauce and



High 5 Communications. The consultants, with the feedback and valuable input from stakeholders, developed a robust collection of assets to support the campaign. These assets include a new website, a collection of videos on this area and other digital assets.

Much of the funds for this first phase of the talent campaign was invested in video, a website and market research. A second phase is planned for late 2024 and early 2025

that would partner with public/ private sector employers to fund digital advertising and other outreach. The Workforce Coalition can now deploy a consistent marketing message to those seeking employment in the region to retain our current population and grow our talented workforce for years to come.

Collaboration on Talent Initiative is Great to Witness

"Do you think Jefferson City really wants to grow?"

Those nine words were a huge motivation to me personally and eventually led to a talent retention and attraction campaign described by Gaye Suggett in her column on page one of this edition of Chamber Today. They were uttered a few months back by Greg Callahan, factory manager of Hitachi Energy, who is the Chamber's strategic partner when it comes to talent and workforce development.

I want to talk about some additional people who I personally credit for their behind-the-scenes efforts to make this collaborative effort a reality. The commitment to address a workforce shortage came out of the Workforce Coalition, a joint

venture of the Chamber and the Jefferson City Regional Economic Partnership. Coalition Co-Chairs are Paula Benne, C & S Employment Solutions, and Amy Sublett, Central Region Workforce Development Board. Sublett also chaired a Talent Attraction Team that worked for over a year on campaign development.

We have worked with three great consulting firms to build "JCMOLiveGrowHome." The work started with market research gathered by Darren Heckman at High 5 Communications. Some fantastic video footage and photography was compiled by Johnny Eaker and Seth Phillips of Cosmic Sauce. The marketing plan, website and other digital assets were created by Aaron DeBuhr and his team at Imagemark Marketing & Advertising.

In addition to these professional consultants, the project benefitted from members of the Talent Attraction Team who rolled up their sleeves and brought their expertise to the table over the past year. Team members included Sublett plus Mayor Ron Fitzwater, City of Jefferson; Presiding Commissioner Sam Bushman, Cole County; Diane Gillespie and Alexandra Bobbitt, Jefferson City Convention & Visitors Bureau; Luke Holtschneider, Jefferson City Regional Economic Partnership;

In addition, the campaign wouldn't have been possible without other volunteers who lent their support. A group of major employers participated in a focus group to help identify community needs and campaign objectives. About 20 "transplants" to Jefferson City who now work for a variety of area employers were interviewed to help identify the campaign message. And dozens of volunteers, many of which were recruited from the Young Professionals network, gave their time and talents for the video produc-
